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TO FIGHT AND DEFEAT THE SATANIC BONDAGE OF SCHIZOPHRENIA IN YOUR MIND YOU WILL NEED THE MIGHTY POWER OF THE LIVING PRESENCE OF JESUS IN YOUR HEART

“In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God’s will”.

Romans Chapter 8, verses 26-27

In preparing a person for deliverance, it is important first to make sure that they are living in a right relationship with God having accepted His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, as their own personal Lord and Saviour.

I am so thankful that before the hell of schizophrenia hit my life at the age of 24 and robbed me of 26 years, I had been living and growing in the love and knowledge of Jesus Christ and was thereby better equipped to face the devastating struggle ahead.

The times as a schoolboy when I used to slip into the toilets at morning breaktime to read my Daily Bible notes, growing up and mixing with fellow "young" Christians in the youth club, finding God in a new way at Bible College at the age of 20 all these poured God's wonderful grace into my spirit where He lived and reigned.

When the mental bondage erupted in my life - as a blanket of demonic power engulfed my mind - I was reeling much more than having received a boxer's powerful knock-out punch. I could only hang on to God and His Word in sheer utter confusion, helplessness and weakness.

I've often thought - but what about those who are hit by schizophrenia and never have the fortunate blessing of knowing Jesus before the bondage dawns on their lives. To suddenly find oneself "taken over" by a demonic force that turns your life upside down and inside out is a total blow indeed.

My testimony bears record to the fact that while I struggled over and over again - having at times to ward off demons of suicide who had joined the nest with the main demon of schizophrenia - my refuge was securely found in God's grace and his Word (the Bible). So how much more do others struggle who are not in a living relationship with Jesus Christ to see them through? In a word, it's difficult.

How for example does a schizophrenic cope when the powerful voices he keeps on hearing have a field day and are pressing with suggestions that he goes and jumps in front of an oncoming train or into a river "to end it all". You need the stronger voice of the Holy Spirit in your life to contend with such demonic intrusions into your thought life and keep sanity intact. Jesus said: **"My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no-one can snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no-one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. I and the Father are one."**
John 10 verses 27-30.

I'm sometimes asked: "What was it like suffering with schizophrenia?" My reply usually follows in this way: "Schizophrenia is total isolation and confusion. You are struggling to survive. In my confusion of mind, I am so thankful I knew God through his indwelling Holy Spirit who kept shedding the light of truth through His Word the Bible into my life. I could not have coped without the ministry of Holy Spirit. I was unable to see myself as others saw me and unaware of their deep

concern for me. I found it needful to lean hard on God himself at times through periods of long confusion. When I came through to full freedom in Jesus nearly 20 years ago, I had a greater appreciation of the wonderful refuge I had found in God and the sufficiency of his ever lasting arms. (see Deuteronomy 33 verse 27).

So here's the main thrust of what I want to say. If you are a schizophrenic and at present do not know Jesus Christ as your living Saviour and Lord, then why not TODAY become rightly related to him. You do that simply by recognising He died for you on the cross of Calvary over 2000 ago to give you eternal life (see John 6 verse 54). The sins that separated you from God were placed on Jesus. He took your penalty and paid the price you should have paid by dying in your place. And through his love and mercy He extends to you right now His wonderful offer of reconciliation. Repenting of your sin and inviting Christ into your life brings his living presence into your life through the power of the Holy Spirit. That act equips you better to fight and defeat schizophrenia.

Come in as my Saviour to cleanse me. Come in as my Lord to control me.
